PANELFIT to host 14 Mutual Learning Encounters in 2021



As part of the commitment to co-creation and dissemination, **PANELFIT** will organise a series of workshops, 14 in total, from March through October 2021, targeting **data experts** from both academia and industry, **policy makers**, and a range of **stakeholders** within the **information privacy** and **(cyber)security** fields.

Following a **Mutual Learning** approach, the workshops will aim at gathering feedback from the project's main **outputs** – the Guidelines, the Code of Conduct on Data Protection for RRI, the Governance Report of Ethical and Legal Issues in ICT Research and the Critical Analysis – as well as to exchange knowledge and experience on topics such as data **commercialisation**, **informed consent**, and **security**.

The first encounters will happen already in March and April and will be dedicated to discussing the **Code of Conduct** on Data Protection for RRI and the **Guidelines** by way of case-studies on **AI, IoT** and **Biometrics** technologies. For further information go to our website:

Consortium Meeting PANELFIT


At the Consortium Meeting held on December 2020, the status of the different work packages was checked in order to update the progress of the project.

Some of the topics discussedwerethe next revision of the **Guidelines** and the implementation of the **Mutual Learning Platform**, as well as the celebration of the next activities and events. The PANELFIT project continues to make good progress in achieving its objectives.

OBCT has published a new article on Edjnet on behavioural advertising and the issues for data protection

Google and Facebook dominate behavioural advertising, even with the cookie crumbling.

Action is being taken to **increase transparency** on the processing of users' personal data on the internet, but the main digital advertisers still rely on **intrusive practices** that try to influence people's behaviours. European regulation on data protection could mitigate the issue, but its enforcement is limited.



Webinar on data protection in journalism

We are about to hold the first webinar on data protection in journalism, held by OBCT in cooperation with UPV/EHU. It has not been published yet, but it is already possible to register. **Data protection in journalism: practical tools**

The European legal framework on personal data protection is constantly evolving and the issue of citizens' privacy is increasingly central to the public debate. It is crucial for journalists to move confidently in this area, to ensure that people's fundamental rights are respected while fully fulfilling their reporting role.

During this webinar, the **Practical Handbook for Journalists on Data Protectio**n will be presented. This tool will be enriched over the coming months with the input and suggestions of journalists themselves, and will soon be available online. In a spirit of participatory development, the webinar will include an open space for questions, from which we will take inspiration to expand the Handbook.

The event will be led by **Iñigo De Miguel Beriain**, senior researcher at the University of the Basque Country, and moderated by **Federico Caruso**, a collaborator of OBC Transeuropa.

Future-Proofing Disruptive Technologies: Policy Options for the Ethical Governance of AI and Emerging Digital Technologies

Joint event of the EU Projects SIENNA, SHERPA and PANELFIT in collaboration with STOA

This event takes its point of departure from the current **discussion and legislative agenda of AI** and asks the question which issues and challenges of AI are in need of particular attention, how can they be addressed and how can we build on what was learned during the AI discourse to prepare for the next wave of scientific and technological advances to ensure these are beneficial and their risks are addressed early.

Background

The three EU projects <u>SIENNA</u>, <u>SHERPA</u> and <u>PANELFIT</u> represent a € 10m investment in research from the European Commission to develop **governance structures** that are sensitive to **ethical and human rights** concerns of **emerging technologies**, notably including artificial intelligence (AI) and big data. The three projects are working with European Parliament's Science and Technology Options Assessment panel (STOA) to host the event.
