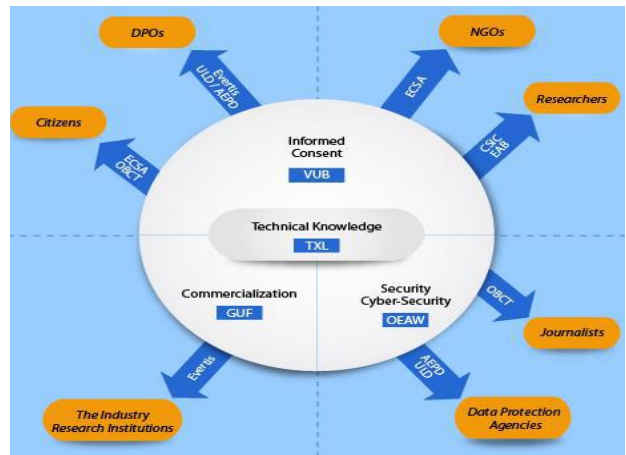

## PANELFIT'S APPROACH: A CO-CREATION PROCESS



### ACTIONS:

- 1) The creation of a compendium of the regulatory framework on data protection, informed consent, data commercialization and security/cybersecurity issues: **Guidelines on the Ethical and Legal Issues of ICT Research and Innovation**, to facilitate the accomplishment of legal obligations by end-users in general and especially SMEs.
- 2) The elaboration of a critical analysis of the EU regulatory framework on ICT research and innovation pursuing two main targets: to **uncover the ethical issues that have not been addressed adequately by the regulation and the legal issues and main gaps that might exist within the EU regulation**, at the national level or in the relation between those levels.
- 3) The **elaboration of a detailed report on the governance of the whole system according to the experience gained by the stakeholders and policy makers involved**.
- 4) The creation of an interactive tool, the **Platform for Mutual Learning**, intended to serve as a reference forum for academics, stakeholders and policy makers interested in the ethical and legal issues related to data protection and use in the ICT research and innovation field.
- 5) The adoption of a rough number of initiatives devoted to **improving the knowledge of the new regulatory framework and the ethical and legal issues involved in selected communities** –researchers and journalists – and among citizens in general. We will elaborate handbooks, codes of conduct and information packs as well as promoting a huge number of engagement and dissemination initiatives, such as monthly chats, MOOC courses, face-to-face courses, dissemination events, and public discussions...

## PANELFIT IN A NUTSHELL

Changes in the EU'S regulation of ICT research and innovation are opening a new scenario. Stakeholders, policy makers, and end users must adapt to them as soon as possible. This, however, might be hard. PANELFIT, a European Commission research's project, is firmly committed to facilitating this adaptation process.

### PROJECT PILLARS:

*"Data commercialization, informed consent and security, are the key topics on which the new EU legal framework should focus and the three pillars on which PANELFIT will mainly concentrate"*

### OBJECTIVES

1. To **facilitate** the implementation of European data protection new regulation by producing a set of **outcomes** that serve as operational **standards** and practical **guidelines** able to reduce the ethical and legal issues (ELI henceforth) posed by ICT technologies while **promoting innovation** and market growth, enabling high-quality job creation and ensuring a **high level of privacy** and security/cybersecurity.
2. To suggest possible concrete **improvements** to the current **regulatory and governance framework** for the same purpose
3. To create **mutual learning** and **support tools** and to promote networking among stakeholders and policy makers
4. To increase the **quantity and quality** of the **information** available to policy makers, professionals, journalists and lay people.
